Symbol	Knowledge
	Christians believe Jesus lived and taught 'good news' or the gospel in the way he behaved and lived life as well as with the parables he told and miracles he performed.
	Christians believe it is through Jesus' death and resurrection that people are healed from the damage done by human sin.
	Jesus' way of living is challenging and turns many logical thoughts upside down! E.g. in the Sermon on the Mount he favours the weak and vulnerable and not making people comfortable.
	Christians believe they should share Jesus' way of life in the world in all areas e.g. in the church, work, their personal life, with family, neighbours, friends, the local, national and global community.

	Forgiveness	A conscious, deliberate decision to release feelings of resentment or vengeance toward a person or group who has harmed you.
	Justice	People behave in a way that is fair, equal and balanced for everyone.
	Fairness	Impartial and just treatment or behaviour without favouritism or discrimination.
	Generosity	The quality of being ready to give more of something - can be money or help.
	Moral	Ideas or habits of behaviour that relate to what is right and what is wrong.
	Dilemma	A situation in which one has to choose between two or more things, ways, or plans that are equally unsatisfactory.
