

- Could there be a big question box in school that you base your CWs around?
- Could you give pupils challenges to think on or complete before the next CW?
- Could you encourage school to have a CW pupil group to help plan and lead CW?
- Could you encourage pupils to write their own prayers, poems and/or reflections to read out next time?
- Could you invite pupils, staff and parents to events and services in y

Practical ideas



Ideas outside of CW

- Could you write something for the school newsletter connected to something about the Chrisitan faith to engage with. Maybe a question could be posed?
- Could you offer one lunch as a drop in, to answer any questions pupils or adults may have?
- Could there be a pupil and/or staff prayer box that you take back to Church and include in Sunday prayers or small groups?
- Could you offer to listen to children read?
- Could you volunteer to walk pupils to and from Church / swimming etc...?
- Could you volunteer to serve tea and coffee at parents evening?
- Could you offer for work to be displayed at Church and invite parent;
- Could you organise suppers to get to know school community?
- Could you open Church up as an afterschool drop in space?


