- 3. To be able to go away from here and put some of your ideas into practice within a CW.


Collective Worship

Ingredients of CW

There is not a set way of doing collective worship but sometimes it is easier to plan with a structure. Here is the 4 main sections you could use:

- 1. Gather
- 2. Engage
- 3. Respond
- 4. Send



Ingredients of CW

Let's look at each one and have a think about how your school CW includes these sections. Look at the next slide too and have a think about what else your school could do for the different sections of CW. Use the worksheet to record your ideas.

GATHER

A chance to set the scene of CW. It should feel different to any other part of the school day. How do you welcome one another? Is there something to listen to or look at which makes it feel like a different time of day to everything else you do? Is it calm, peaceful and inviting?

RESPOND

This should be a time where you get to think about what you have engaged with in the last section. This could be some questions to reflect on, some time to pause and think, a song to listen to or sing which is linked to the theme of what you have learnt and/or a time to pray.

ENGAGE

A chance to really look into something and learn about something. This could be a Christian value or a story from the Bible. It could be a world event or looking at another Religious worldview, but in a Church of England school we do need to link it back to Christianity. You could so this by researching what the Bible says linked to the world event or the similarities between Christianity and another religion.

SEND

This is a way to close the CW and send everyone out. This could be to music or a way of saying goodbye to one another. You can also give everyone a challenge or something to think about or do linked to the CW. CW should be impacting the way we think about behave. You could choose to pray in this section instead and link the pray to a challenge and something to think about.

GATHER	ENGAGE	RESPOND	SEND
 Having a candle, Bible, cross etc on the table when pupils enter. Does the leader light the candle or do the pupils set the CW symbols out? Liturgical colours for different parts of the Christian year Thought of the day displayed for pupils to reflect on when they enter. Anglican greetings said at the start of CW. Reflective/calm music when pupils enter. A picture displayed for reflection. 	 Reading out verses or a chapter from the old or new testament in the Bible. Video to reflect the theme or festival/celebration which is the focus Display pictures that show the theme or festival/celebration which is the focus of the CW. Act out stories/passages from the Bible by giving pupils speaking parts. Use guided meditation and invite pupils to imagine a story you read out. Use hymns and songs that tell the story and ask pupils to explain what the song was about. 	 Invite children to think of a tsp prayer to themselves. Music can be played to help. Pass a heart, a stone etc. around the circle Use traditional prayers such as the Lord's prayer or the Grace. Pass on a sign of peace or link arms/clap hands. Place a stone at the foot of a cross Drop pebble in water Light a candle Breaking of bread Write personal prayers on post-its Singing a hymn or song that links to the theme of the CW. 	 Share what you have learnt with others Shake hands – sign of peace Find a few moments in the day to say thank you to God. Tell your mum/dad you love her/him Care for God's world by picking up a piece of litter Remember to say please and thank you Anglican phrases used to send pupils out Greet someone with a smile Do something helpful at home Invite someone lonely or isolated to join you at break time. Make an internal promise Make a vocal promise


Ingredients of CW

Can you sing or dance and could do that in the respond section?






Praying

Look at the prayer frames on the next 2 slides and have a go and creating your own prayers.


How could you do this more regularly in CW at school?
