

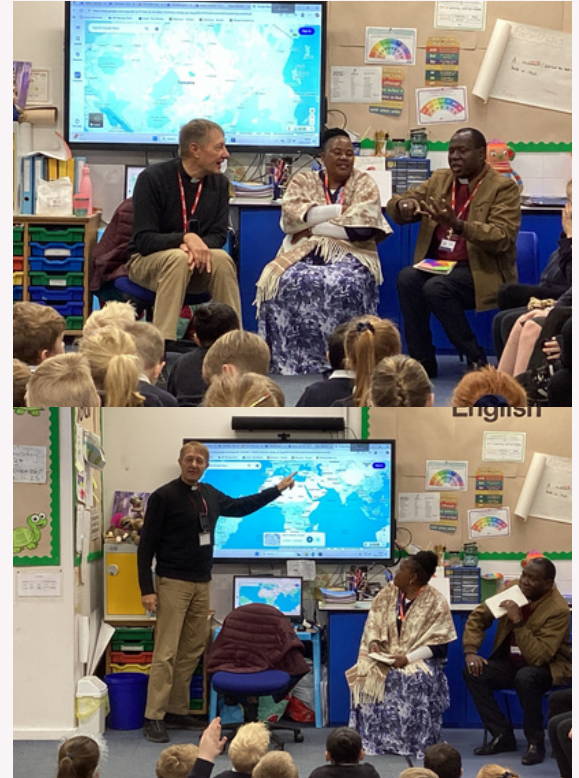

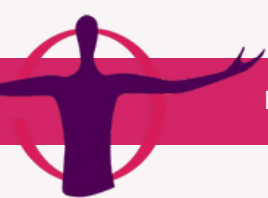


Holocaust Memorial Day Resources

Bringing together practitioners, researchers, policymakers and funders to build a stronger evidence-base, better policy, and enhanced support for Service children's education and their progression.

Underpinned by rigorous research and thoroughly tested in schools, the organisation offers a **free Thriving Lives Toolkit**, which provides schools with a framework of 7 principles through which to reflect on their practice and a 3-tier set of CPD resources. The resources in this toolkit have been developed in collaboration with a range of partners across the UK, and consist of:

- An introductory animation;
- A detailed resource introducing the evidence base, what schools can do to support their Service children and who can help and;
- School case studies

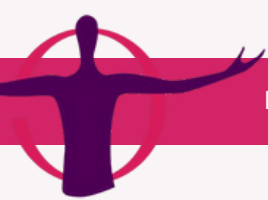

Whose Worldviews? Resource

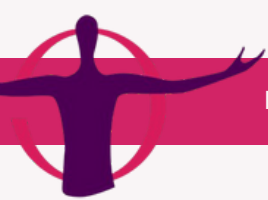
["Whose Worldviews?" is a free resource](#) for you to use with your pupils by RE Today. It is best suited for use with secondary pupils but could be used by pupils age 9-11 in the primary classroom.

Pupils (and anyone else!) can respond to questions about their idea of God, and the impact their worldviews have in their lives, and have their responses turned instantly into a graphic representation. These can then be compared across a group or a cohort, sorted according to age, location, religious or non-religious worldview. Teachers can [set up a group](#) to enable pupils in their classrooms to see visual representation of their ideas about God and how far ideas of religion have an impact on their personal worldview.

Please note that this is a public website and take care with any names/labels that identify your pupils too easily.

Right of Withdrawal for RE and Collective Worship

Guidance published by the DBE has been updated recently to reflect the Supreme Court's recent ruling in Northern Ireland about a parent's right to withdraw their child from RE and/or Collective Worship. School leaders and governors should read the guidance published [HERE](#). Any guidance on your school's website should also be updated.

The key message is that in the event that a parent/carer requests for their child to be withdrawn from RE and/or Collective Worship, then this request should be granted without any delay. Schools should not insist that parents/carers meet with them before granting the request.

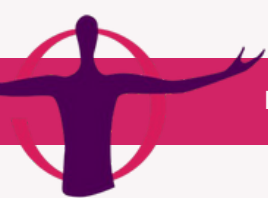
Leicester Cathedral Price Increase

From February 23rd Leicester Cathedral's school pricing structure will be increased. Due to rising operational costs, it has become necessary for Leicester Cathedral to increase their prices and they have worked hard to keep these at a competitive rate and in line with similar establishments.

Please be reassured that any bookings made prior to these changes will be honoured at the original rate.

The new prices, which will apply to all school visits booked from **23rd February**, are outlined below:

- Self-Led visit was 50p per student and the **new price will now be £1.00** per student
- Taster Visit was £2.50 per student and the **new price will be £3.00** per student
- Half Day visit was £4.50 per student and the **new price will be £5.50** per student
- Seasonal Half Day visits (Like Easter and Christmas workshops) was £5.00 per student and the **new price will be £6.00** per student
- Big Questions was £60 per group and the **new price will be £72** per group
- Multi-Faith visit was £6.50 per student and the **new price will be £8.00** per student.

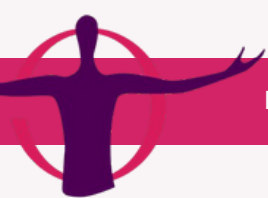

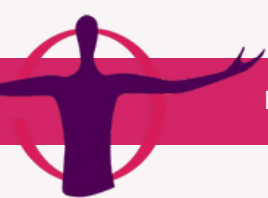
WHAT TO EXPECT:

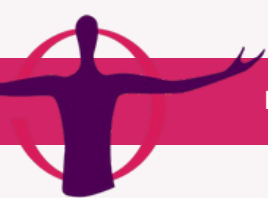


